Why is organic agriculture an integral part of the future of agriculture?



Value increase through short supply chains, and local provenance Better efficiencies in technology to reduce high labour costs

Decreasing the toxins and pollutants across water systems Increased water efficiency due to high levels of carbon in soils

### First Steps to Disaster Recovery



#### Ascertain disaster need

- Activate community, how can they be involved?
- Connect story, create local action plan
- Build volunteer team based on needs



#### Find your local action partners

- Collective and targeted action
- Past experience, elders, wise people
- Build your pathway to make a difference



#### Fundraising mechanism – which one suits?

- Charity (check their ethos)
- Local community group
- Local cooperative direct member to member



### Direction Action from ORICoop



#### Each farm application received:-

- Funded soil & biology tests as starting point
- Support phone call are you ok?
- Appointed specialist organic farm consultant



#### Action Plan established between farm & consultant including:-

- Restoration plan for farm business
- Soil, land and ecosystem recovery
- Strategic funding application



#### **Bushfire Committee:-**

- Rating of each farm based on funding criteria
- Consideration of size, merit & damage to farmland
- Terms of Reference with aligned values

### **Outcomes of Appeal**



- 6 fire affected regions, 14 organic farm applications
- Many farms have still received little external support
- All farms now with action plans & restoration pathways



- \$85,000 raised direct from community
- Monies to be distributed according to ethos of ORICoop
- True value of member to member owned cooperative
- Regional and volunteer collaboration critical



- Beyond Bushfire Appeal
- Pathway to Emergency Fund for organic businesses
- Funding mechanism to replicate and scale
- Farmers in need need community not charity

- Funding for Local workshops identified by each region
- Local community connection between producers




- Ecological recovery through biodiversity & wildlife
